

The 2013 – 2014 Pupil Premium funding for Great Denham Primary School is **£34,200**.

The Pupil Premium funding that is received by the school annually is used in a variety of ways in order to improve pupil attainment and to help overcome any barriers to learning. We have researched and analysed extensively, to inform us of the best ways to use this money. Below we have outlined how we have used and are planning to use the money effectively~

Effective feedback:

- Parents of vulnerable children are invited to attend termly, in-depth consultation meetings with the teachers to discuss ways to accelerate progress, using agreed 'structured conversations' to provide a coherent format. Teaching cover is required for this time.
- All children are given clear steps to move forward, on a daily basis, through Assessment for learning.

Early Years intervention:

- EYFS and other groups have been screened to identify vulnerable groups and are supported in class, through targeted intervention.

1-2-1 tutoring:

- Lessons have been timetabled to allow individual tutoring for targeted children.

Family Support Worker

- A family support worker has been employed to work with many of our children. She will support families in many aspects of school and home life.

Teaching Assistant Support

- Since April 2013 the school has employed teaching assistants to work in each class and who will focus in on supporting children. These children have individual targets to ensure that focused support is appropriate and that it ensures that any gaps in achievement are narrowed quickly.

Pupil Progress Meetings

- Release time is planned for teachers to allow for 'pupil progress meetings' to ensure that the gap is narrowed for vulnerable groups.
