Year 6

At the end of last term, Y6 children entered their classroom to find a Christmas tree.... of books! They were very excited to find out that they had been given numerous new books for their classrooms. From books based on Alice in Wonderland to the Guinness book of records, there was something



for everyone. We hope they enjoyed their read over the Christmas holidays and we look forward to seeing which book they choose next.



Since then, Year 6 have become fully immersed in their new project 'Ancient Greece'. The children have learnt which continent and hemisphere Greece lies in and some of the children shared their experiences of visiting Greece. After locating Greece, we placed the period on a 'tape measure timeline'. We discovered that it began longer ago than we first thought!



During our stunning start, the children received a mysterious note, written with the Greek alphabet, from a character called Elliot. He asked the children to answer some key questions in order to go on a journey with

him. To help with our research, a historian came into school. The children enjoyed their day - wearing costumes and masks to role play some of the myths and legends which were important to the Greeks.

More recently, the children were shocked to find a cow shed in the middle of their classroom! There were hanging stars, a glittery constellation and lots of copies of 'Who Let the Gods Out?' hanging from the ceiling. They quickly

discovered that this book was our key text for the term. The children came up with some fabulous predictions of what could happen in the book and we have just begun reading the first few chapters. Next, we shall explore and analyse the key characters of the book including: Virgo, Picses and Mr Sopweed. This will support us in writing a diary entry in the shoes of Elliot, the main character.



Alongside our project, Year 6 have been practicing the songs and actions for our Young Voices concert at O2. We can't wait for the show next week and look forward to seeing lots of you there!


