# YEAR 6 UPDATE

Year 6 have well and truly delved into their new project, putting themselves in the shoes of Victorians and debating the question 'were they really hard times?' The children attended a coronation party, where they tasted cucumber sandwiches, scones and tea. During our experience day, they took on the role of a Victorian child and learnt about life in the classroom - they have all agreed that school today is far more pleasant!





Currently, Y6 are enjoying finding out about the stark differences between the rich and poor, focusing mainly on the character Jim Jarvis from the book 'Street Child'. The children have worked hard to understand the events of chapter one to four. From this they have written a setting description focusing on use of powerful language to engage their reader.

After half term, the children will begin to explore Victorian homes. Learning about iconic Victorian architecture. Over half term, it would be wonderful if the children could explore our local area to see if they can spot any bay windows or iron railings! We shall be sketching Victorian buildings and critiquing along the way, until we get our final pencil drawings.


