We are very lucky to have a dedicated car park for parents to use rather than on the surrounding roads.



Our key text 'War Horse' has been helping us understand how the war would have influenced families and communities, through the eyes of Albert - Joey's owner. Albert's emotions, thoughts and feelings were explored through role-play and the children wrote diaries as a reaction to the sale of Joey, who was now destined to become a 'war horse'.

The children have also produced some fantastic sketches of Joey, after getting expert advice from Mrs HB! This week, we have written persuasive speeches and presented them to a local parish councillor, as we were upset to hear that Great Denham's memorial had been vandalised and we wish to make our own memorial in Great Denham to mark remembrance day this year.
