

### Nursery

The children have settled in very well in Nursery and it has been lovely to watch them shine. Our topic this term is 'Who am I?'; through this we have delved into knowing each individual child, their interests and who they are and where they come from?

We have talked about people who help us outside school, and it was during this time that we had a visit from the Police who spent time talking to the children about how they help people. The children were in awe and were so excited about sitting in the Police car and wearing the Police hat. The



innocence of children is real when it is time for the question-and-answer part and one child asked the police officers "have you been to dinosaur world?" Dinosaurs are very important when you are 3 and 4 years old.

Following on from this the children were introduced to people who help us in school. Three members of staff were asked to be interviewed by the Nursery children, the chosen ones were Mrs Smith (our lovely lady in the office), Emma (family support officer) and the main person, Mrs Burgess herself. Well done to all of you for the excellent teamwork you showed throughout. Looking forward to next week already!


