






YEAR GROUP UPDATE

What could be growing in the eggs was a big question?



Nursery

This term the children are learning about 'Down on the Farm'. They came into find muddy footprints, wellies and some seeds that had been left. Later in the week Farmer Ted had left a letter asking if the children could help him by planting some seeds and looking after some eggs.





It wasn't long before we found out what was in the smaller eggs as our chicks began to hatch. Meet the fantastic four, "Flash, Chicky, Custard and Rosie". The children were so excited and couldn't wait to hold and care for the chicks.





As the other eggs were bigger and still had not hatched, we discussed as a class what could be growing in those eggs. We had lots of ideas from a sparkly unicorn, a crocodile, a penguin, shark and a whale. Following on from this we then researched what animals do come from eggs?

To our amazement and a little bit of relief, the eggs have started to hatch and we have learnt that in our eggs were some ducklings and not a crocodile.... phew!!!

Through this learning they have learnt how to care for living things and begin to understand the life cycle of animals.

As we continue with our project, the children will begin to find out what does happen "Down on the Farm".

The children are looking forward to going to Standalone Farm on the 9th June where they will have the opportunity to experience a working farm in action.

Year 3 / 4 Quad kids Athletics



Milton Keynes Museum is inviting youngsters to go wild this May, with two-days of wildlife themed activities.

Many of our native species are struggling to co-exist in today's modern world, but whether it's planting the correct flowers to help our pollinators or creating hedgehog spaces in our gardens, we can all help to make a positive change.
